
President's Annual Report



This year, we proudly continue to celebrate the 25th Anniversary of the Educational Foundation of Watertown. What began in 1999 with a modest \$100 donation has grown into a powerful commitment to educational excellence for the teachers and students in our community.

As we look ahead to 2024, our goal is to award \$50,000 in grants to teachers in both public and private schools throughout Watertown. In 2023, we exceeded our target of \$35,000 in grant awards, distributing over \$40,000 to support classroom projects. Watertown's highlights, including the public library, Bentzin Town Square, and many beautiful, historic areas of our town. Best of all, every dollar raised benefits students across Watertown, both in public and private schools.

\$17,697 in 2023 and \$100,000 Overall

Last year, we raised an impressive \$17,697 for the Ed Foundation of Watertown, and since the Jig Jog's inception, we've proudly



contributed over \$100,000 to the Foundation, thanks to the generosity of our amazing community. As always, we need your help to make this year's event a huge success.

The Numbers

The Educational Foundation of Watertown received 74 Grant Applications totaling \$56,240 for 2023. We were able to fund 60 (72%) of the applications which totaled \$40,260. Forty percent of the grant monies were awarded to private schools and 60% to public schools of Watertown.

Projects Fueled by Your Support

Examples of projects fueled by your support in classrooms include: Flexible seating and Sensory Tools, Books for Classrooms - elementary through high school, Science and Math Manipulatives, Materials and Equipment for Playgrounds, Scripts for Speech and Drama Collection, Sanding Equipment for Woodshop, Technology including Chrome Books and iPads, Repair and Rehabilitation for Outdoor Agriculture Education Space, Baseball Gloves for Physical

Education.

The grant committee considers all applications and uses a variety of criteria to choose grant



awards. We seek out projects that stimulate academic achievement and provide enhanced learning opportunities. We encourage creative and innovative educational enhancements. We want to address all populations of students - youngest to oldest; all areas of education; and continued availability of technology. We support academic achievement, as well as social/emotional growth of students. We also look at the number of students who will be impacted by the grant project and the duration and continued use of the funded materials.

A Legacy of Support for Watertown Schools

The Educational Foundation of Watertown Celebrates 25 Years

In January 1999, the Educational Foundation of Watertown held its first meeting, committed to strengthening public and private schools in Watertown. Founding members included President Ray Kubly, Vice President Cathy Kwapil, Secretary Belle Luhman, and Treasurer Mark Sweet, along with additional board members and representatives from the Watertown Unified School District.



Ray Kubly: A Lifetime of Service

Ray Kubly, the Ed Foundation's first president, was a lifelong Watertown resident and a 1942 graduate of Watertown High School. Ray had a remarkable history of service, both to his country

and his community. During World War II, while serving as a bombardier in the 8th Air Force, his plane was shot down over German-occupied Holland, and he was taken as a prisoner of war before escaping with the help of the Dutch Underground. Ray was awarded the Purple Heart for his bravery. Beyond his military service, Ray was heavily involved in the Watertown community, serving 16 years on the Watertown School Board, holding leadership roles at Immanuel Lutheran Church, and being a member of the Lions Club, Country Club, and Elks Club. As president of the Educational Foundation, Ray's goal was to raise funds to enhance education in Watertown schools, a mission his wife, Ruth, children and grandchildren continue to support. Ray passed away in 2008, leaving behind a legacy of commitment to education, community service, and family.

Randy Phelps and Neale Jones: Continuing the Tradition

Randy Phelps and Neale Jones, each with 25 years of service to the foundation, also have deep ties to the Watertown community.

Randy, now retired after a 32-year career with ORBIS Corporation, where he was Vice President of Business Development and Acquisitions, has used his expertise in finance and negotiations to benefit the foundation.



His skills also played a crucial role when he helped negotiate the sale of Watertown Hospital to LifePoint. Randy remains actively involved in the community, serving on the Watertown Hospital Joint Venture Board, the Greater Watertown Community Health Foundation, and the Rainbow Hospice Foundation. His dedication to Watertown's health and safety has been invaluable.

Neale Jones, a lifelong community member and retired livestock marketer, has also been instrumental to the foundation's success. In addition to his role as Treasurer of the Educational Foundation, he's been deeply involved in agriculture-related organizations,



including serving as a 4-H Beef Project Leader and Chairman of the Livestock Meat Animal Sale at the Dodge County Fair. Neale's commitment extends beyond education—he has served as Chairman for the Town of Shields for 40 years and remains an active member of Immanuel Lutheran Church. His leadership and dedication to local agriculture are well respected.

From \$50 Each Granted to 2 Teachers in 1999 to \$42,260 Granted to 60 Teachers in 2023!

In 1999, the Ed Foundation awarded its very first grants, giving \$50 each to a teacher in a Watertown public school and a teacher in a Watertown private school. Today, the Foundation has grown significantly, awarding \$42,260 in 2023 to 60 teachers across Watertown's schools. The Ed Foundation supports projects that encourage innovation, promote excellence in education, and enhance student wellbeing. As we continue to celebrate our 25th anniversary, we aim to fund \$50,000 in grants to benefit public and private school teachers.
