
President and VP's Annual Report





The Educational Foundation of Watertown is excited to announce that we will reach our 25th Anniversary during the 2024 Grant Cycle. We will continue our mission of promoting excellence in education for the students of the Watertown District and are setting a goal of \$50,000 for that Grant Year. This special commemoration will honor our Founding Family of Ray and Ruth Kubly. It was

Ray's vision that began a quarter century of dedicated donations and fund raising participation that continues to impact the resources we put in the hands of Watertown teachers and students.



The 2022 Grants exceeded our goal of \$33,000 as we awarded \$35,023 for 65 grants to public and private teachers in the district. Our plan for 2023 is to meet or exceed a goal of \$35,000.

It is the generous support of individuals and businesses that allowed the Educational Foundation to surpass our Grant Goal by \$2,023. Through the generosity of Piggly Wiggly and their customers, the **Educational Foundation** received \$2,000 during their February Round-Up Event.



2022 Grants Awarded

The Foundation was able to fund 65 grant applications totaling \$35,000 awarded to public and private schools of the Watertown School District. There was a wide variety of grant application ideas. The funding can be broadly categorized in the areas of 14% for Flexible Seating; 14% for Books; 10% for Playground Communication Boards; 10% for Technology Equipment; 7% for Art and Music; and the remaining 45% covers a variety of requests across the curriculum and teaching areas.



The requests for flexible seating is directed at the goal of helping students focus better and get movement without being disruptive to others. Students feel empowered when they have some degree of choice and control over their environment. Flexible seating allows students to choose where

Of course, additional book and reading resources are always highly desired in the classroom. Some books are used to remediate and extend reading skills in early grades. Others are used to enhance the skills of Advanced Placement

Language Arts students at high school.

Playground Communication Boards were funded for all WUSD **Elementary Schools** to increase the communication skills of nonverbal and minimally verbal students served in special education

classrooms. These Boards allow all children to develop friendship skills and increase peer interactions during physical activity.

Art programs are enhanced at RMS by Mosaic Mural Supplies to support a collaborative, creative experience that will improve the aesthetics of the school environment. An additional pottery wheel at WHS will serve more students and more efficiently than current older wheels.

These are a few examples of ways the Educational Foundation of Watertown continues to support and encourage teachers in our district to provide the best resources to their students.
